One of the finest regional art museums, the Farnsworth Art Museum contains a nationally recognized collection of works from American artists. Its collection highlights artists with associations to Maine and includes works by Louise Nevelson, N.C. Wyeth, Andrew Wyeth, and Jamie Wyeth. Its campus also includes a library, the Wyeth Center, the Farnsworth Homestead, and in nearby Cushing, the Olson House, site of the painting "Christina's World."

Camden Hills State Park is a publicly owned recreation area overlooking Penobscot Bay. Two of its main attractions include:

Maiden Cliff Hike: A very popular hiking trail which gives spectacular views of Megunticook Lake and the surrounding mixed forest. With an incline closer to hills than mountains, this makes it ideal for families with children as well as view-seekers. The overall degree of difficulty is low with just moderate inclines and is only 2-3 miles in length.

Drive up Mt. Battie Auto Road. The scenic vista gives sweeping views of the bay and surrounding islands. On a clear day Cadillac Mountain in Acadia National Park can be seen. This view is especially popular with leaf peepers in the fall. A fee is charged for the drive to the top.

Birch Point State Park is a state park in Owls Head, Maine, that is known for scenic views of Penobscot Bay as well as its crescent-shaped sand beach, known as a "pocket beach." It allows swimming in gentle surf; however, no lifeguards are present. Great for picnicking or fishing.

The Rockland Ferry Terminal services the islands of North Haven (12 miles out; 1 hour+ trip) and Vinalhaven (15 miles out; 1.25 hour trip). Making several trips daily, these are car ferries, but round trip sightseeing voyage excursion tickets are available for foot passengers. These islands are residential fishing communities. Vinalhaven has a village area with a handful of shops and a few restaurants; North Haven has a general store and a restaurant or two—all of which vary in accessibility and distance from ferry docks.

Craig Brook National Fish Hatchery was established in 1889 to raise and stock juvenile Atlantic salmon for Maine waters. Craig Brook currently raises seven river-specific brood stocks of Atlantic salmon. Facilities at the site include a nature trail; an indoor Visitor Center; library and archives (access by request), an Atlantic Salmon Flyfishing Museum, and boat launches and picnic areas on both Alamoosook Lake and Craig Pond.
