*Birch Point State Park is a state park in Owls Head, Maine, that is known for scenic views of Penobscot Bay as well as its crescent-shaped sand beach, known as a "pocket beach." It allows swimming in gentle surf; however, no lifeguards are present. Great for picnicking or fishing.*

From the intersection of Route 1 and 131 in Thomaston, travel approximately five miles south on Route 131 and turn right onto Wiley's Corner Road followed by an immediate right onto a gravel access road and parking area.

*The Fort Point trail is a Universal Access trail. It consists of a hard packed 3' wide surface and 5 cedar boardwalks to traverse wet areas. The Fort remnants are to the left and center of the small peninsula, where an earthen mound is visible. The Point offers 180 degree views of the St. George River.*

*The Rockland Ferry Terminal services the islands of North Haven (12 miles out; 1 hour+ trip) and Vinalhaven (15 miles out; 1.25 hour trip). Making several trips daily, these are car ferries, but round trip sightseeing voyage excursion tickets are available for foot passengers. These islands are residential fishing communities*

Its campus also includes a library, the Wyeth Center, the Farnsworth Homestead, and in nearby Cushing, the Olson House, site of the painting "Christina's World."*

*Craig Brook National Fish Hatchery was established in 1889 to raise and stock juvenile Atlantic salmon for Maine waters. Craig Brook currently raises seven river-specific brood stocks of Atlantic salmon. Facilities at the site include a nature trail; an indoor Visitor Center; library and archives (access by request), an Atlantic Salmon Flyfishing Museum, and boat launches and picnic areas on both Alamoosook Lake and Craig Pond.*
